-Was previously called “Promise for the future”

-What is it?

- 2 years (Fall/Spring) of tuition free Central Arizona College

-Guidelines: Begin the fall semester after high school graduation

- Complete the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) at www.fafsa.gov
- Upon high school graduation complete and submit the online [CAC Scholarship application](#) and in the application attach an unofficial high school transcript with graduation date
- Enroll in a minimum of 12 credit hours per semester
- Pursue a CAC degree or certificate program

Central Arizona College

Pinal Promise:

-Renew for each semester (4 total)

- Maintain a minimum 2.0 cumulative GPA
- Enroll in a minimum of 12 or more credit hours per semester
- Complete a minimum of 9 credits each semester
- Maintain continuous enrollment each semester excluding summer term
- Allow the Financial Aid office to verify and ensure student meets eligibility requirements at the end of each semester. If the student is unable to meet the requirements he/she will permanently lose the tuition funds.

Going on a Mission After High School?

MISSION



Some things to keep in mind:

Apply for colleges and scholarships **BEFORE** you leave on your mission.

Apply for FAFSA before you leave on your mission even though you will not be using the funds you receive the following year.

Once you accept a college's offer, call the school's Financial Aid Department to defer your admissions and scholarships.

Merit Scholarships

- ▶ On the next slides click on the college's logo to learn more about their Merit scholarship program.
- ▶ Most public colleges offer Merit scholarships.
- ▶ Merit scholarships can only be applied to tuition.
- ▶ Merit scholarships are renewable, meaning you'll receive Merit scholarship funds each year you attend college.
- ▶ Merit scholarships are only for incoming freshman; however dual enrollment courses do NOT affect your incoming freshman status, even if you earned an Associate degree in high school.
- ▶ If you take too many community college courses after you graduate from high school, you may jeopardize your incoming freshman status. Contact the college's admissions office or representative to see how many college credits you can earn after graduation and still be considered an incoming freshman.

Steps to Apply

Step #1: Complete an Undergraduate Admission Application

- ☐ Apply online with [ASU's Application for Admission, Common Application](#) or the [Coalition Application](#). You need to submit only one application to be considered for admission to ASU.
- ☐ To expedite the admission decision, [self-report your high school grades](#) in the application.

ASU does not prefer which application you use to apply. ASU does not require an essay or personal statement in any of these options.



Step #2: Submit the nonrefundable application fee

- ❑ Arizona residents: \$50
- ❑ If you applied for admission through the [Common Application](#) or [Coalition Application](#), pay the application fee through those applications.

There is no form, paper or code to submit for an application fee waiver. If your financial circumstances qualify you for an application fee waiver, you will answer a series of questions in the application that will automatically qualify you and post to your account.



Step #3: Submit Official Transcript

- ❑ If you do not self-report your high school grades in the application, you must have your high school send an [official copy of your transcripts](#) to ASU.

Step #4: ACT or SAT scores (optional)

- ❑ ACT or SAT scores are not required for admission but may be submitted for ASU course placement or as supplemental information. Have your scores sent to ASU from [ACT](#) or [College Board](#) when you register for the test.



Step #5: Check application status

- ❑ Once you've completed all these steps, ASU will review your application. To see if you have any missing items and to review your admission status, sign in at My ASU using your ASURITE UserID, which is sent to you after you apply for admission. [Check application status](#)

Step #6: Fill out the FAFSA

- ❑ The Free Application for [Federal Student Aid](#) is used to award grants, loans, Federal Work-Study and certain scholarships. We encourage you to compare financial aid and college costs. ASU's Federal School Code is 001081.

- ☐ Apply online at [FLAGSTAFF CAMPUS](#)
- ☐ Access your unofficial high school transcripts to self-report your grades and test scores.
- ☐ Submit a \$25 non-refundable application fee.
- ☐ Send your official test scores for scholarship consideration. NAU's school codes are **ACT** 0086 & **SAT** 4006.

Steps to Apply

Step #1: Start Your Application

- ❑ It's comprehensive, convenient, and fully online.* When completing your application, it's helpful to have a copy of your high school transcripts and around 30 minutes. Need to take a break and finish later? You can save your progress and pick up where you left off any time. [Start My Application](#)

*If the application fee is a burden due to your family's financial situation, you may qualify for a fee waiver that can be requested as you are completing your application.

Step #2: Report Your Grades and Finalize Your Application

- ❑ On your application, you will be asked to self-report your grades. This means you should enter your courses and grades exactly as they appear on your high school transcripts, including any in-progress senior year coursework.

Step #3: Application Review Process

- ❑ Once your application is submitted, our review process typically takes about 2-4 weeks. Be sure to check your [Future Wildcat](#) account for status updates on your application. [Application Review Process](#)

Step #4: Financial Aid and Your FAFSA

- ❑ Apply for financial aid by completing your Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA), which is available each year on October 1. Don't forget to use Arizona school code **001083** when filling it out. The priority deadline for submitting your FAFSA to Arizona is **March 1**. [Apply for Your FAFSA](#)
