Degree Type: Graduates of community colleges generally earn associate's degrees or professional certificates, while university graduates earn a bachelor's degree, or in some cases, a master's or doctoral degree.

Cost: Affordability is one reason why some student choose community college.

Admissions Requirements & Selectivity: Most community colleges have open admissions policies and will admit anyone who has graduated high school. Universities are more selective in their admissions process.

Class Size: Classes at community colleges are often smaller than comparable courses at universities.

Academic Resources & Options: Universities have a huge edge when it comes to academic resources and options. Universities offer a variety of programs you're unlikely to see at community college, like study abroad, etc.





All students who reside in Pinal County and graduate from a Pinal County high school are eligible for the Pinal Promise Program and will receive two academic years of tuition (fall/spring, fall/spring) covered by CAC and the CAC Foundation. There is no high school GPA eligibility required to apply. This is a last-dollar scholarship and students must complete the FAFSA each academic year!

To be eligible, a student must:

- Begin the fall semester after graduation- Fall 2026
- Have completed 20 hours of community service (<u>Community Service Form</u>). Students who have not
 completed their community service hours may do so during their first year at CAC, but it is strongly
 encouraged that you complete these hours before high school graduation.
- Complete the 2025-2026 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)!
- · Upon high school graduation, complete and submit the online CAC Scholarship Application.
- · Submit a copy of high school diploma OR an unofficial high school transcript with the date of graduation.
- $\bullet \;\;$ Enroll in a minimum of 12 credit hours but no more than 20 credit hours per semester.
- Pursue a CAC degree or certificate program.

To renew eligibility each semester, a student must:

- Maintain a 2.0 cumulative GPA or above
- Enroll in a minimum of 12 or more credit hours per semester.
- Successfully complete a minimum of 9 credits each semester.
- Maintain continuous enrollment each semester (Fall/Spring, Fall/Spring. Not including summer semesters).
- Allow the Financial Aid office to verify and ensure student meets eligibility requirements
 at the end of each semester. If you are unable to meet requirements, you will
 permanently lose the tuition fund.

Great news! If you already have a student account with CAC because you've enrolled in dual enrollment or concurrent classes, you do not need to reapply! After graduation, simply send your final unofficial transcript with your date of graduation on it to admissions@centralaz.edu and ask to have the high school hold removed from your account!

- Once you accept a college's offer, call the school's Financial Aid Department to <u>defer</u> your admissions and scholarships.

MERIT SCHOLARSHIPS

Arizona State School 2024-2025* Merit Scholarships

- Most public colleges offer merit scholarships.
- · Merit scholarships can only be applied to tuition.
- Merit scholarships are renewable, meaning you'll receive merit scholarship funds each year you attend college.
- Merit scholarships are only for incoming freshmen. Dual enrollment does NOT affect your incoming freshman status, even if you earned an associate degree in high school.
- If you take too many community college courses after you graduate from high school, you may jeopardize your incoming freshmen status
- MERIT SCHOLARSHIPS DO NOT REQUIRE A SEPARATE APPLICATION AT ARIZONA IN-STATE UNIVERSITIES. ALL FIRST-YEAR
 APPLICANTS WILL BE CONSIDERED FOR MERIT SCHOLARSHIPS. YOU MUST COMPLETE FAFSA BY THE DEADLINE TO BE
 CONSIDERED.

WHAT IS CORE GPA?

Not the GPA on your transcript--this GPA includes ALL high school classes!

- Four years of high school English
- Four years of high school math
- Three years of high school lab science (one year each from biology, chemistry, earth science, integrated science, or physics).
- One year of HS American History AND one year of another HS social science (world history, economics, psychology, government, etc.
- One year or a two-semester combination of high school fine arts
- Two consecutive years of the same second language (not reg'd for NAU)

HOW DO I CALCULATE MY CORE GPA?

- 1. Request your Heritage transcript from Miss Bocchinfuso.
- 2. Identify your grades in the courses listed to the left. If you have more years of qualifying classes than required in a subject, select your top grades in that subject (American history must be 1 for social sciences).
- 3. Go to https://www.calculator.net/gpa-calculator.html
- 4. Enter your grades for the required courses. If you received the same grade both semesters, enter 1 credit. If you received a different grade each semester, list the course twice (0.5 credit each) and enter your individual semester grades.
- 5. Click "calculate". This is your CORE unweighted GPA.
- 6. You can use the GPA planning calculator to determine the GPA you would need next semester to reach your GPA goal.



What is FAFSA and why should I complete it my senior year?



WHAT IS FAFSA?

The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) form is an application for federal student aid. This form helps determine your eligibility for aid such as grants, work-study, scholarships, and loans after graduating high school for post-secondary education. Completing and submitting the FAFSA form is free.

WHY COMPLETE THE FAFSA?

Information submitted on the FAFSA can qualify students for other non-federal grants-- from state governments, private entities, and colleges themselves.

WHEN DOES THE FAFSA OPEN?

The FAFSA typically opens on **October 1** each year. Due to the updates/changes made in 2023-2024, the FAFSA will be available to all families this year on or before December 1, 2024. They expect that next school year's FAFSA (2025-2026) will be released by **October 1, 2025.**

WHAT SHOULD I DO TO PREPARE? -- Create your FSA ID over the summer or at the start of senior year.

The FSA ID is a username and password that all contributors use to log in to certain U.S. Department of Education websites including <u>fafsa.gov, studentaid.gov,</u> and <u>studentloans.gov</u>. The FSA ID is a student or parent's legal electronic signature. The FSA ID will be used every year to fill out the FAFSA.

Once an FSA ID is created, it can take 3-5 days to process. Therefore, you will not be able to create an FSA ID and complete the FAFSA on the same day.

ALL CONTRIBUTORS TO THE FAFSA FORM MUST HAVE THEIR OWN FSA ID!

The FAFSA is only for loans. ->

Not at all. In fact, the FAFSA form is one of the most widely used tools to access student aid, such as grants, work-study and scholarships.

I won't qualify for aid. ->

Even if you don't qualify for free aid such as the Federal Pell Grant, many institutions require a FAFSA on file to grant access to any form of merit-based scholarships a student may have earned

I can't submit the FAFSA if I haven't chosen a college. →

You can list up to 20 schools on your FAFSA. It's better to submit early, even if you haven't decided where you'll attend.

I only need to submit the FAFSA form once. → You have to fill out the FAFSA form every year you're in school to stay eligible for federal student aid, but filling out the renewal FAFSA form takes less time.

I support myself, so I don't have to include parent information on the FAFSA. →

This is not necessarily true. Even if you support yourself and file taxes on your own, you may still be considered a dependent student for federal student aid purposes.

According to a new analysis by the National College Attainment Network (NCAN), the high school class of 2023 left more than \$4 billion in Pell Grants on the table by not completing the FAFSA.

• In Arizona, the average Pell Grant awarded in 2023-2024 was \$4,938

In Arizona, the total Pell Grant dollars left on the table by the Class of 2023 was \$112,131,026

MOST college <u>require</u> the FAFSA to be completed EACH YEAR-- even to receive university aid and scholarships!

REMEMBER: After completing the FAFSA form, you will receive a financial aid offer letter. YOU will decide which aid offers to accept. Just because aid, such as loans, are offered does not mean you are obligated to accept them!
